POSITIVE COVID-19 CASES SHOULD STAY HOME until acute symptoms have cleared (usually 5 to 7 days).

Although many COVID restrictions have been lifted and parents/carers are welcome to be on site and enter classrooms, we ask that all adult visitors practise physical distancing when on site and not attend the site if they are unwell. Please continue to advise us if your child is COVID positive and keep them home whilst unwell.

UPDATE FOR FAMILIES

TERM 2 PRESCHOOL STAFF

CHOIR

Our Choir had their “assessment” with Festival of Music leader / conductor Cathy at the end of last term. She was very impressed with the enthusiasm, song knowledge and team work of our choir. Mrs Fahlbusch and Mrs Jenkins were very proud of them, given that we had really had only 4 or 5 sessions. We are looking forward to performing at an assembly later this term.

AUSTRALIAN CURRICULUM and SCHOOL REPORTS

The Australian Curriculum sets the expectations for what all young Australians are taught from Foundation (Reception) to Year 12. Research clearly demonstrates that parent interest and encouragement contributes to children’s academic achievement so it is very important for parents to have a general understanding of what their children are learning and where they are on their learning journey. Families are the first educators of their children and they continue to influence their children’s learning and development during school years and beyond. During term 2, teachers will be preparing written reports for students showing achievement in the first semester. In years 1-6 the report will show the student’s level of achievement using an A-E word equivalent grading system, as well as their effort. Reception students are not “graded”. As with all methods of feedback, the written report will give parents and students a guide to their achievements so far this year and importantly what areas to work on and improve throughout the remainder of the year.

PUPIL FREE DAY – Different for School and Preschool this term

Please be aware that there is a pupil-free-day **FOR PRESCHOOL ONLY** on **Friday 9th June** before the long weekend (in order to work with other preschools).

On **Tuesday 13th June**, after the long weekend will be a **SCHOOL ONLY** pupil free day where school staff will be involved in professional learning and students do not attend school. OSHC service will be available on this day. Preschool will also run on this day.

SCHOOL ARRIVAL

Students are not to be at school before the 8:30am bell as there is no supervision. Please drop off after the bell or remind children who walk to school themselves of what time they can be at school from. This is a safety and duty of care priority.

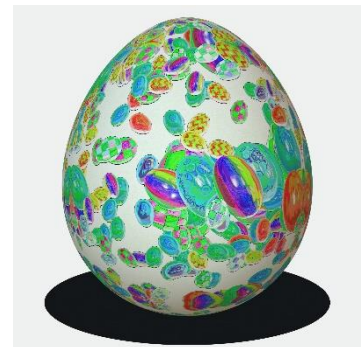
