<u>Proposed Pupil Free Day</u>: A Pupil Free Day has been ratified for term one in week 6 on **Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March**. Staff will be working on literacy professional learning as part of our improvement work. Other Pupil Free dates for 2024 ratified by Governing Council include: Term 2, Week 7 – Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> June; Term 3, Week 7 – Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September and Term 4 Week 6 – Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November. A Closure Day was ratified for Term 4, Week 5 – Friday 15<sup>th</sup> November.

<u>Volunteering:</u> Anyone interested in Volunteering at Freeling Primary School requires a Working With Children Check (WWCC), and must complete online RAN (Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect) Training and a site induction. Working with Children Checks require renewal every 5 years. If you would like to volunteer, please contact Luke Shepley via the front office for an application form, and he'll be happy to discuss the required process with you. A Volunteer Induction session will be conducted later in the term for applicants.

<u>Breakfast Club:</u> We have had a strong turnout for the return of Breakfast Club this year. FPS are very fortunate to have a community of willing volunteers to run this valuable program each week on Wednesday mornings. If you are interested in helping, please contact the school.

<u>Assemblies:</u> Assemblies will be held on Thursday afternoon in weeks 3, 6 & 9 in term 1 at 2:30pm under the COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area). On days when the temperature is predicted to be over 35 degrees in the afternoon, our Assembly time will be moved to 9:05 am.

<u>Swimming:</u> Students from Reception to Year 5 are very excited that warm to hot weather has been forecast for next week's swimming / water safety lessons. Please ensure all clothing (including underwear), towels and personal belongings (lunch boxes / drink bottles etc) are labelled with your child's name. It will be imperative that all students bring sunscreen and rash vests given how hot some days could potentially be. Be aware that buses depart school early each day, so students in the first lesson (Rooms 1, 6, 9 and 10) depart school at 8:50am. Also remember to NOT park in the bus zone at the front of the school.

<u>Vandalism</u>: It's unfortunate that we have seen a lot of vandalism on school grounds after hours and on weekends. The presence of security cameras throughout the school seemingly doesn't discourage acts of vandalism on school grounds. Where possible, if individuals are identifiable from video footage, we have communicated with their parents first, giving them the opportunity to speak with their child. Due to the costs incurred from recent vandalism to school fencing and property, police have promised to increase patrols in the area.

<u>NAPLAN 2024:</u> Next week Yr 3 students will have the opportunity to participate in a NAPLAN practice test, as we check to ensure our digital devices and the NAPLAN platform are ready for the real testing, which will be conducted from 13<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> March. <u>Festival of Music (Senior Choir)</u>: Year 5 & 6 students were invited to a Come and Try Choir on Tuesday, with one of our biggest turnouts of 33 students. This year's theme is "The Arts" with specially commissioned works from Robyn Habel and Adam Page. This year (2024) is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Abba winning Eurovision, so there are a few Abba tributes also in the repertoire. We think parents will enjoy these! Students will later in the year travel to Adelaide's Festival Theatre to perform in the South Australian Public Primary Schools Festival of Music, as well as being a regular feature at school assemblies. Choir forms and payment need to be returned by 26<sup>th</sup> February.

#### Is your child taking up the PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE in 2024?

Premier's Reading Challenge is designed to:



#### WATER SAFETY PROGRAM

The Water Safety program will occur for all students in Reception to Yr 5 at the Gawler Pool in Week 4, Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February to Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February.



Students will travel by bus in shuttle runs having separate sessions on arrival at the pool. JP students receive a 45 min lesson and primary students a 90 min lesson.

Invoices (blue) and Swimming Aquatic Consent forms (white) have been sent home. Signed consents with full payment must be made by **Thursday 15**<sup>th</sup> **February**.
