Pupil Free Day

On Monday 2nd September, staff continued their professional learning in the Public Education Strategy, specifically looking through the lens of Wellbeing, as an area of impact.

The Strategy for public education in South Australia has 4 areas of impact that describe the choices that we have made about what we are seeking for every child and young person in SA. They are what we will prioritise and resource to successfully deliver on our purpose. The areas of impact are all interrelated and are underpinned by a series of domains, which are the outcomes we're aiming for.

The wellbeing area of impact has 3 domains.

- 1. Belonging and safety: Learners feel they belong, are culturally safe, and are free to experiment, to raise questions and learn without feeling threatened.
- 2. Resilience and persistence: Learners have the capacity to cope with day-to-day challenges and persevere when faced with new or complex learning situations.
- 3. Cognitive engagement: Learners have the mental capability to engage actively in learning and feel stretched and challenged.

Our work has included reflecting on our site's Wellbeing data and building our understanding of creating trauma-informed strength-based classrooms.

Mobile Phones

Recently we have had to remind some students about the Department for Education and Freeling PS expectations about digital devices such as mobile phones and smart watches, as they and some families were unclear about these. A full copy of the policy is available on the school website, but in a nutshell, mobile phones and smart watches should be switched off and handed to class teacher on arrival at school (or at least off and away until they get in to their class to give to their teacher). They are then collected at the end of the day.

Extract from FPS Policy:

Mobile phone use for primary school students

The department's position is that primary aged students cannot use their mobile phones and personal devices (such as smart watches) at school during school hours. The department and the school recognise that there are legitimate reasons for students to bring a mobile phone or personal device to school. This may include:

- to ensure their safety while travelling
- so that parents can contact them outside of school hours.

During the school day students are not permitted to access or use their mobile phones or other personal devices. Students must switch off or mute their devices before storing them at the beginning of the school day. They will not be able to access their device until the end of the school day.

Storage of personal devices

• Personal telecommunication devices are brought to school at entirely the owner's risk. If a student brings a device to school, it is their own responsibility.

Students:

- are not to have telecommunication devices in their possession during school hours
- will pass their devices to their classroom teacher or the front office at the beginning of the school day to be stored
- will ensure that their devices are turned to silent or off
- will collect their devices from their classroom teacher or the office at the end of the day.

If the student does not comply

If a student is found to not be following this policy staff will:

- confiscate the device with student agreeance and securely store it until the end of the school day. If the student does not agree to the confiscation, the Behaviour Management policy will be followed
- communicate with parents or caregivers about the incident

Holidays / Exemption request

if you are planning a family holiday during term time and your child will be away for more than 4 days, an exemption from attending school is required. Please remember to contact the front office so an application form can be sent home to you.

If you are unsure of your eligibility and require further assistance contact the Finance Office. If you are found to be ineligible for School Card then you are liable to pay the full amount of Materials & Services Charge.


