Welcome Back

Welcome back to Term 4. We hope you had a restful and enjoyable holiday break. Term 4 is the shortest term, being only 9 weeks long, and with so many events planned and learning to be done, it's sure to go by quickly. Of note are the School Concert (Thursday the 14th of November), followed by a School Closure day (Friday the 15th of November), and Pupil Free Day (Monday the 18th of November). We also have transition visits planned for our Preschool and Reception students, and our Year 6 students will have their final transition visit before starting high school next year. Planning for 2025

The process of placing students in classes each year is extremely complex. Factors that impact on class placement include: the chronological age of students, social, emotional, behaviour and learning needs, teacher recommendations, student requests, parent requests and the overall composition of each class. Class teachers survey students for their requests as part of this process.

To help us plan each year, we request families contact the front office as soon as possible if they know:

- child(ren) will NOT be starting at or returning to Freeling School P-6 (excluding year 6 students moving to high school).
- they or any family/friends are intending to enrol children in our school or preschool for 2025.

If families have information specific to children's learning, social or emotional needs that they would like us to consider in the class placement process (<u>do not request specific teachers</u>) this should be <u>submitted in writing addressed to Angela Jenkins and dropped in at the Front Office or emailed to <u>dl.0139.info@schools.sa.edu.au</u> by Friday 25th October (week 2 term 3). We appreciate that families take time to provide us with any considerations with regard to class placements in writing, however, it is unlikely that we will be able to accommodate all requests. Our aim is to provide the best teaching and learning environment for our 250+ students. We will endeavour to meet parent requests where possible, in the best interest of the teaching and learning environment for all students. We are hoping to have 2025 class placement information to families before the end of the school year. Once class placements are finalised and parents are notified of this in writing no changes can be made.</u>

SA Curriculum

In 2025, teachers will be familiarising themselves with a new curriculum for South Australian schools, by building their knowledge and understanding of two subject areas. year 6, and our Festival Choir.



In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception. Children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31
 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.



Register your interest for 2025

Registrations of interest are now open to start school in 2025. If your child is starting school in term 1 or term 3, you are encouraged to submit your registration of interest by the end of term 2, 2024.




BOOKINGS


