If your child develops symptoms such as a fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting or extreme tiredness, please get tested.

If your child tests positive, you must inform Freeling Primary School on 85252045 immediately. You must also lodge the positive test result with <u>SA Health</u>

POSITIVE COVID-19 CASES SHOULD STAY HOME until acute symptoms have cleared (usually 5 to 7 days).

Although many COVID restrictions have been lifted and parents/carers are welcome to be on site and enter classrooms, we ask that all adult visitors practise physical distancing when on site and not attend the site if they are unwell. Please continue to advise us if your child is COVID positive and keep them home whilst unwell.

QUICK and EASY COMMUNICATION USING the SEESAW APP

In preparation to receive school information and make contact with your child's teacher, we ask that you download the SEESAW APP available free of charge from the APP Store or GOOGLE PLAY STORE. Information about joining your child's/children's class group has been shared by the class teachers.

Farewell Lesley Handke

On Friday 26th May, many people came to our special assembly and afternoon tea to farewell retiring staff member Mrs Lesley Handke. Many of you, especially the local parents, will have known "Mrs Handke" for most, if not all of your life. She is likely to have contributed to the education of your parents, yourselves and now your children here at Freeling. On behalf of the Freeling Primary and Preschool, we'd like to formally acknowledge the 40 or so years of service she has provided to building our involvement with the Freeling community.

Lesley was first employed at Freeling Primary School 38 years ago, according to our records from July 1, 1985. We all know though, that her involvement started long before she was employed at the school. Many of you may know that Lesley has been a strong voice and advocate for early childhood education and services. She started the Freeling Playgroup in her own home before it was moved to the school. Lesley did not hesitate to make her thoughts and opinions known, and her determination, particularly in not taking "No" for an answer, had long lasting benefits for the Freeling community and its families. Someone I spoke with, described her as a 'dog with a bone' (a friendly one), which has contributed to her many accomplishments particularly in the school and preschool. In fact, a few of the facilities managers that came into the school to assess what needed doing would often ask "is Lesley in today?" Mostly so they could ensure they didn't walk past where she was working as she would always add to the list of things that needed doing! Lesley is also known for her ability to 'volunteer' skilled people to repair, construct and make safe various things for the school over the years.

Throughout the 40 plus years that Lesley has served our community, it has always been with amazing generosity. She has so much knowledge and experience and if only she would have let us take her photo more often, you would see the many skills she has. Lesley has worked across both the school and preschool, in many roles including student support, office/admin, library and grounds/facilities. ALL OF THE STUDENTS KNOW MRS HANDKE! She even braved the week long camp to Canberra with a bus load of highly excited year 7's twice! There is not a water meter or light switch that she doesn't know the location of. She can repair just about anything and there have been numerous times when Lesley was seen carrying a laminator home after work, because someone had jammed it up! She can also make just about anything, her creative flair, has often been seen in our STEM display box windows (which look amazing), not to mention the library displays for Bookweek and the Christmas floats for the Freeling parade over the years.

Lesley has always been a hard-working and supportive colleague to all staff and a reliable and tireless volunteer for the school. Her support to families of the school has been valued over the years. So much so, that we knew that Lesley would occasionally receive a knock on the door or phone call after hours looking for someone the family knew their child would listen to and take notice of! Lesley has been a member of Governing Council and a supporter of our Parents and Friends committee, as well as staff social committee.

We love and appreciate everything you have done Lesley. We can't imagine that retiring means not seeing you here at school. We know and expect to still see you regularly? You are actually part of the furniture, the fabric of the school and we are proud to acknowledge your hard-work, dedication, contribution and generosity over so many years with a

room named in your honour in the preschool. Thank you Lesley!

extend kindness to others and that we all belong at Freeling Primary School" Lesley







































2023 District Cross Country

At preschool, children are learning through play to:


- make friends, share and play with others

- * develop their literacy skills such as listening. speaking and communicating
- * develop maths skills such as counting, measuring, and solving problems

- * bilingual support for children with little or no English
- * educational support for children with hearing, speech or language impairment and children with developmental delay or disability
- * Aboriginal children and children in care can access preschool from 3 years of age
